## **Summer Day Camp 2018**



Summer Day Camp actively engages children with the outdoors, captivating their interest and inspiring them to partner with the natural world. ACNC achieves this by providing campers with time for free play, indirect educational opportunities, interactive lessons, and discovery-based activities.

#### Required at Time of Registration

**Deposit**: \$25 deposit per child per session. The balance is due one week before the start of camp. **T-shirt payment** (if applicable): Camp t-shirts are optional with registrations before June 1. Non-refundable.

#### **Discounts**

Family Memberships and higher receive \$50 off each session and may register January 1. You may purchase or renew a Family Membership for \$55 at registration.

#### **Refund Policy**

If you cancel more than two weeks before camp, ACNC will refund everything except the membership, deposit, and t-shirt fees. There are no refunds for cancellations made less than two weeks before camp starts.

## **Free Exploration Camps**

Free Exploration Camps are nature play-based, driven by the campers' interests. Adults are present to supervise and teach when questions arise. Research shows that unstructured play, especially outdoors, is a key developmental component missing from the lives of many children. Time is divided by 80% nature play, 20% structured. #### **Green Play (Grades PreK - K, Ages 4 - 5)**

# Counselors-In-Training (CIT) and Junior Counselor (JC)

ACNC uses assistants in most camp sessions. CITs and JCs are teenagers wanting to gain experience working with children, volunteer with community organizations, or increase their level of responsibility. ACNC holds a

training session for all CITs and new JCs. Interested teens fill out an application, available online. CITs are 13 – 15, pay half the listed fees and must attend the training, June 25, 1:00 – 4:00 p.m. JCs are 16+ who either have been a CIT or JC previously, or must attend the training session. There are no fees for JCs.

## **Backpacking Adventure**

Campers provide their own gear, Audubon supplies the food. Call the Camp Director with questions. ACNC's refund policy applies until after the first session. After Session 1, refunds minus \$50 will be given if the camper decides against going overnight.

### **Deep and Sticky Learning Camps**
